



## CLIR/DLF Postdoctoral Fellowships in Data Curation for the Sciences and Social Sciences, 2013-2015

*Call for new host institutions to participate in training fellows  
to manage data in the natural and social sciences*



CLIR is now recruiting for academic institutions to host six 2013-2015 CLIR/DLF Postdoctoral Fellows in Data Curation for the Sciences and Social Sciences.

CLIR/DLF Data Curation Fellowships will provide recent Ph.D.s with professional development, education, and training opportunities in data curation for the sciences and social sciences. Through these fellowships, CLIR seeks to raise awareness and build capacity for sound data management practice throughout the academy.

All CLIR/DLF Postdoctoral Fellows must have completed a Ph.D. within the five years preceding their appointments; these appointments will be for two years beginning in the summer of 2013. The fellows' work must draw upon their disciplinary expertise in order to help advance data curation practices and services at their host institutions. The host institutions and CLIR jointly share the salary and benefit costs for the fellows.

Interested prospective host institutions should submit a fellowship proposal form by **October 1, 2012**. Selected hosts will be notified on or before **November 1, 2012**. The fellowship proposal form is available here:
