



This proved to be quite daunting – it seems that Google mostly offers English versions that are recent, as opposed to originals. I did the following searches until I found a book to examine:

1. Marco Polo

2. Travels of Dean Mahomet (1794, M.H. Fisher) - a limited edition was available, but not original.

3. Tales of Moonlight and Rain (1776, Akinari Ueda)

4. The Dancing Girl (1790, Hasan Shah). This book was originally written in Farsi. Google Book's only offers a limited-view of the English translated version by Qurratulain Hyder, 1993. Even after designating language results to Persian, still no original available.

4. The Anatomy of Melancholy, by Robert Burton (1621). A hit! This is the book I'll evaluate today.

All online versions are provided by EEBO - Early English Books Online. It seems EEBO has several different editions of Burton's book, corresponding with each GEORGE result. I'm attaching a pdf file of the 1676 version available by EEBO. Within EEBO, I can change view preference, choosing either record, thumbnails, illustration, or document images. (The durable URL for this visible document is http://0gateway.proquest.com.library.lausys.georgetown.edu/.) I can also download as either TIFF or PDF file, but I can ONLY download each visible page at a time - not the whole document as one file. 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



Today I wanted to search for early grammars written on the Chinese language – or some of the earliest attempts at describing Chinese grammar pedagogy. According to Xing (2006), some of the earliest books on this topic were written by mostly Western missionaries - many used Latin to describe Chinese. The earliest books include Matteo Ricci, 1580; João Rodriguez, 1604; Francisco Varo, 1703; Joseph de Prémare, 1831; Giles, 1872; Hiller, 1886; Gibson, 1887 (Xing pg. 63). I attempted to look for all of these volumes in Google Books.

Matteo Ricci, 1580 - search yielded no results.

João Rodriguez, 1604 - search yielded no results.

Francisco Varo, 1703 – Google Books lists it (arte de la lengua mandarina), but it is not available for view.

Joseph de Prémare, 1831 – Google Books lists it, but it is not available. (Notitia linguae sinicae). 2 other versions are listed but are also not available. There is one full-view version, but it is an edition that was translated into English. Not too much metadata is provided for this book. (Georgetown has this book in off-campus storage).

However, another title by this author, Vestiges des principaux dogmes chrétiens, tirés des anciens livres chinois, is available for full view. I shall do this for my search today – I am curious to see how a book before 1900 with Chinese text is recognized.





Figure 3 : anomaly on page 131



I was at first disappointed at how much of Piaget's material is available on Google books, but is not available for preview. An advanced search setting, designated at only yielded books for full view, do not provide any of his texts. I'll therefore analyze one of his texts available for limited preview – I imagine it must be a copyright issue.

Ok, after some searching, I see that none of his books, particularly Language and Thought and on children's judgment, are available for even partial view- only snippet. I'll do a new edition/translation of one of his texts, The Child's Conception of Physical Causality, done in 1929.






