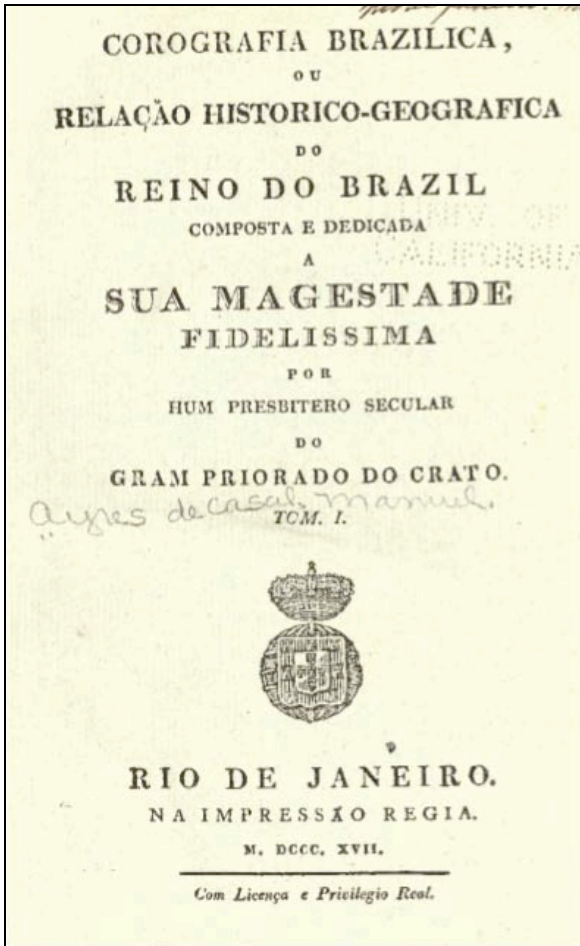

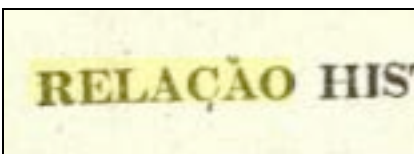
Appendix I – OAT version of title page (left) and GBS (right).



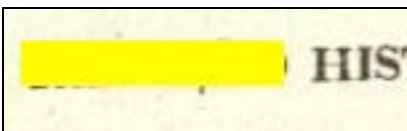

Per Abbad puts the date 1207 after his name, but the existing copy forms part of a 14th century codex in the Biblioteca Nacional de España (National Library) in Madrid, Spain. However, it is incomplete. The first page and two other pages in the middle are missing. It is written in medieval Spanish, the ancestor of modern Spanish.

Its current title is a modern invention by Ramón Menéndez Pidal; its original title is unknown. Some call it El Poema del Cid on the grounds that it is not a cantar but a poem made up of three cantares. The title has been translated into English as The Lay of the Cid and The Song of the Cid. Some English translations include the verse translation of W.S. Merwin and prose translation of Rita Hamilton and Janet Perry.

The ACLS version is the full text while the Google Book version of the 1944 edition by the same publisher is only a limited preview.

It does not however link to any relevant external information regarding the existence of other editions, translations, etc. It also would be nice to have a function where the footnotes link to other pages in the book or external works that are referenced (the same for the appendix at the end).

I would like to comment here that the metadata provided by Google Books on the earlier edition of this book by the same publisher is riddled with errors. First of all, the only tag provided is “Africa” – and yes, Africa has *absolutely nothing* to do with this book. Also one of the chapters is spelt wrong in the table of contents, making the word “Moreira” instead “Morkika”. Please see Appendix I and II.



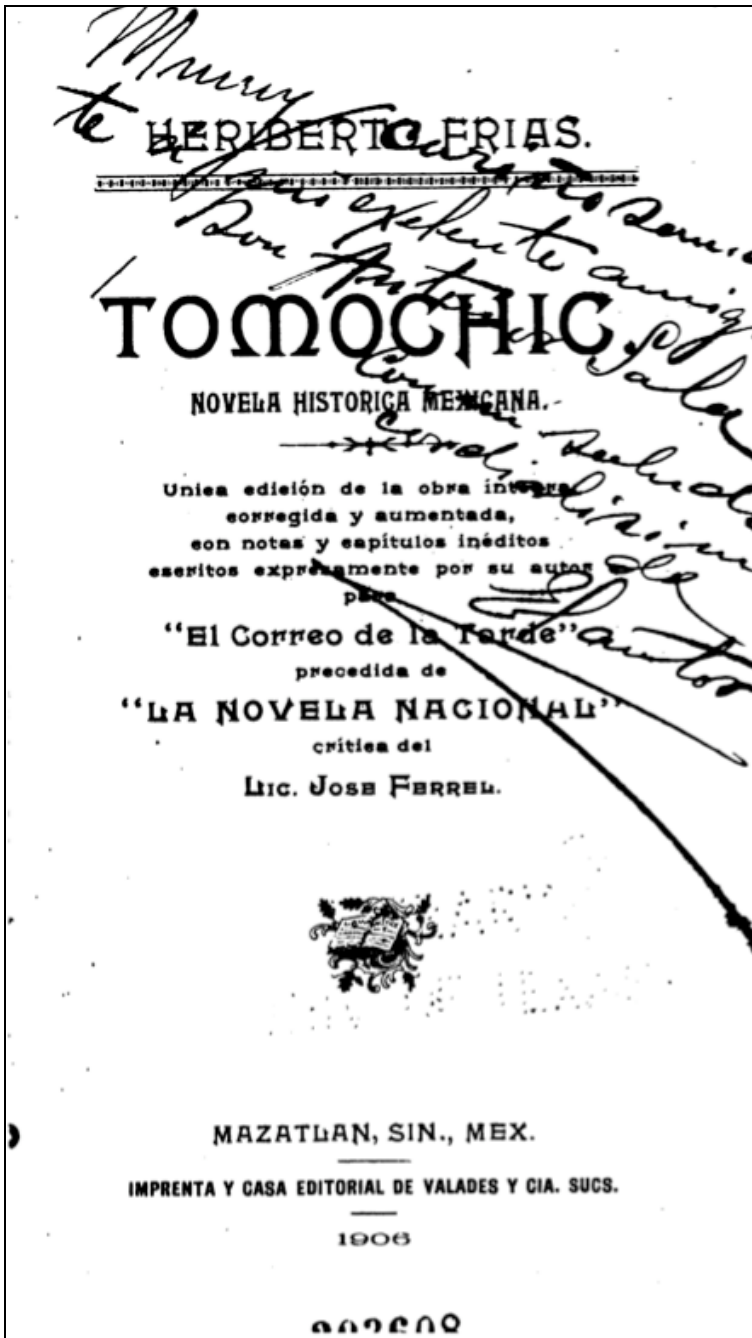

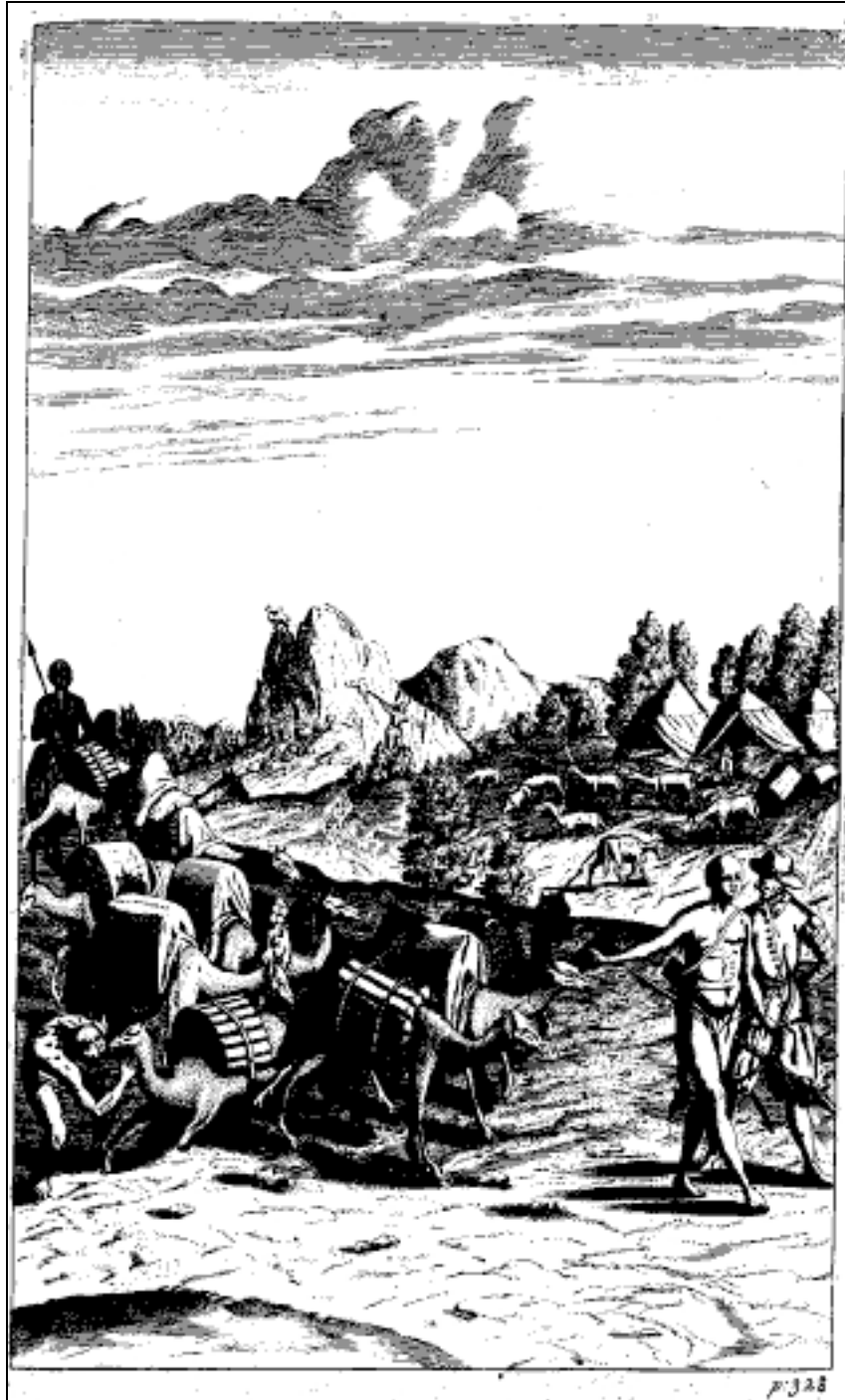

In the other Provinces the Indians perish without Baptism, or any other Sacrament; and no one gives himself the trouble to instruct 'em, as will further appear by an authentick Letter from a Bishop of this Country, who expresses himself in these Terms:

*A Friar Bartholomew de Las-Casas, Monk of the Order of St. Dominique, having signified my desire to be recall'd from the Indies, had leave to come over to the Court of Spain, to give an account of the deplorable Condition of the Indians. To this I have been mov'd by the Zeal with which God has inspir'd me for Souls redeem'd by his Blood. My earnest desire is, that they may know their Creator, and embrace his Word, that they may be sav'd. And I cannot choose but extremely pity Spain, my native Country, because I am greatly afraid God will utterly destroy it, for the enormous Crimes committed by the Spaniards (who go into the Indies) both against God, against the King, and against their Neighbours. I don't doubt but divers illustrious Persons of this Court, who are truly zealous for the Salvation of Souls, are very sensibly touch'd with the Calamities, and Adversities those multitudes of poor Creatures suffer in the New World, who are abandon'd to the fury of the Spanish Soldiers. I resolv'd long ago to draw up an exact Relation of these matters, but have been still hinder'd by the continual urgency of those Affairs in which I have been engag'd till now. However I have at length accomplish'd this design at Valencia, the 8th of December, Anno 1542. This Treatise gives a true account of the Violence, Tyranny, Persecutions, Robberies, Murther, and Despoliations committed by the Spaniards in all the parts of America where they have discover'd themselves.*

*These Calamities and Disorders are advanc'd to a degree that surpasses all belief, and is the most surprising in that the Spaniards are much less furious and cruel every where else. Indeed the People of Mexico and of the places adjacent, are now treated much better than others; insomuch that no body there dares offer violence to any Indian openly: 'Tis true they exact immense Sums of 'em, but the forms of Justice are at least so observ'd, that the People are protected from the Insults and Affronts of such as have more power than themselves. I have great hope our illustrious Lord, Charles the Fifth, Emperor and King of Spain, who begins to take cognizance of the Tyranny and ill behaviour of the Spaniards toward the Indians, will undertake the protection of these miserable People, who are persecuted against his will, as well as against the will of God. All the miseries that have bin inflict'd on these newly discover'd Nations have bin hitherto conceal'd from our Prince with no less fidelity and address than malice. 'Tis now no more to be doubted but this wise Emperor, into whose hands God has cast the Government of those vast Regions; and who bears so sincere an affection to Justice, will give effectual Orders to put a stop to these Persecutions. May God preserve that illustrious Emperor in all the Glory and Prosperity that attends him, for the Salvation of his Soul, and the Prosperation of the Church. Amen.*

A year after the writing of all these matters above recited, there were published in the City of Madrid certain Laws and Constitutions made by his Majesty at Barcelona, in the month of December in the year 1543, which were calculated according to the urgent necessity of Affairs to rectify the Disorders that were then committed with so much insolence both against God and Man, to the utter destruction and desolation of the New World. For the constituting of these wise Laws his Majesty assembled a great many

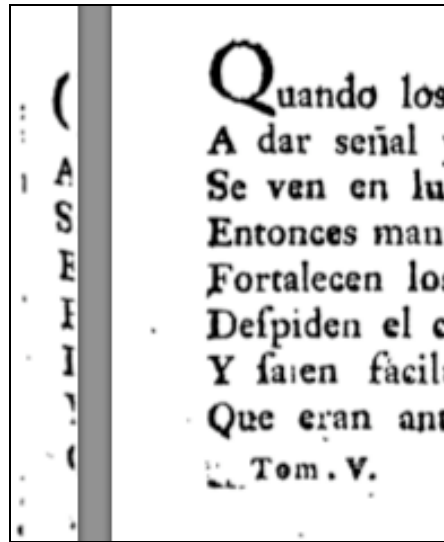

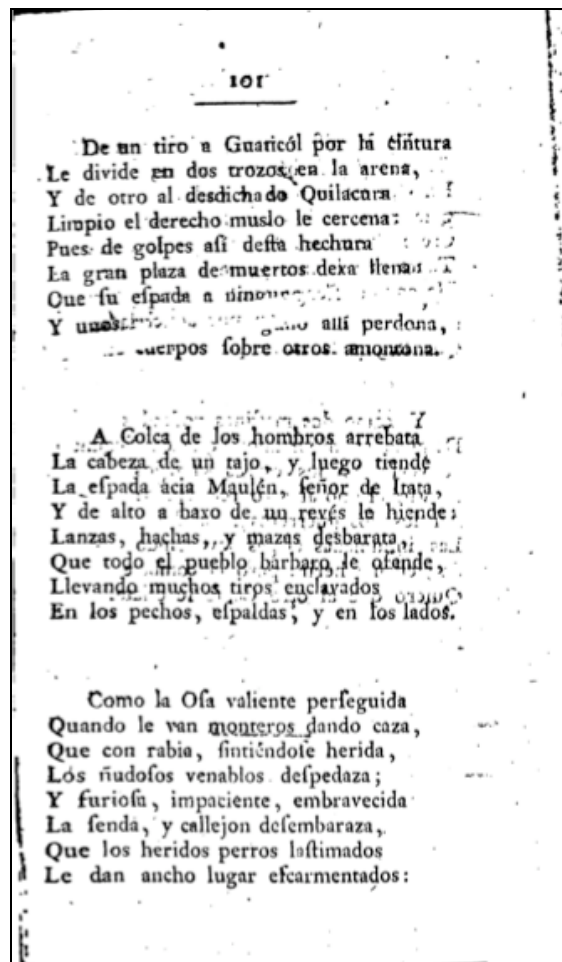

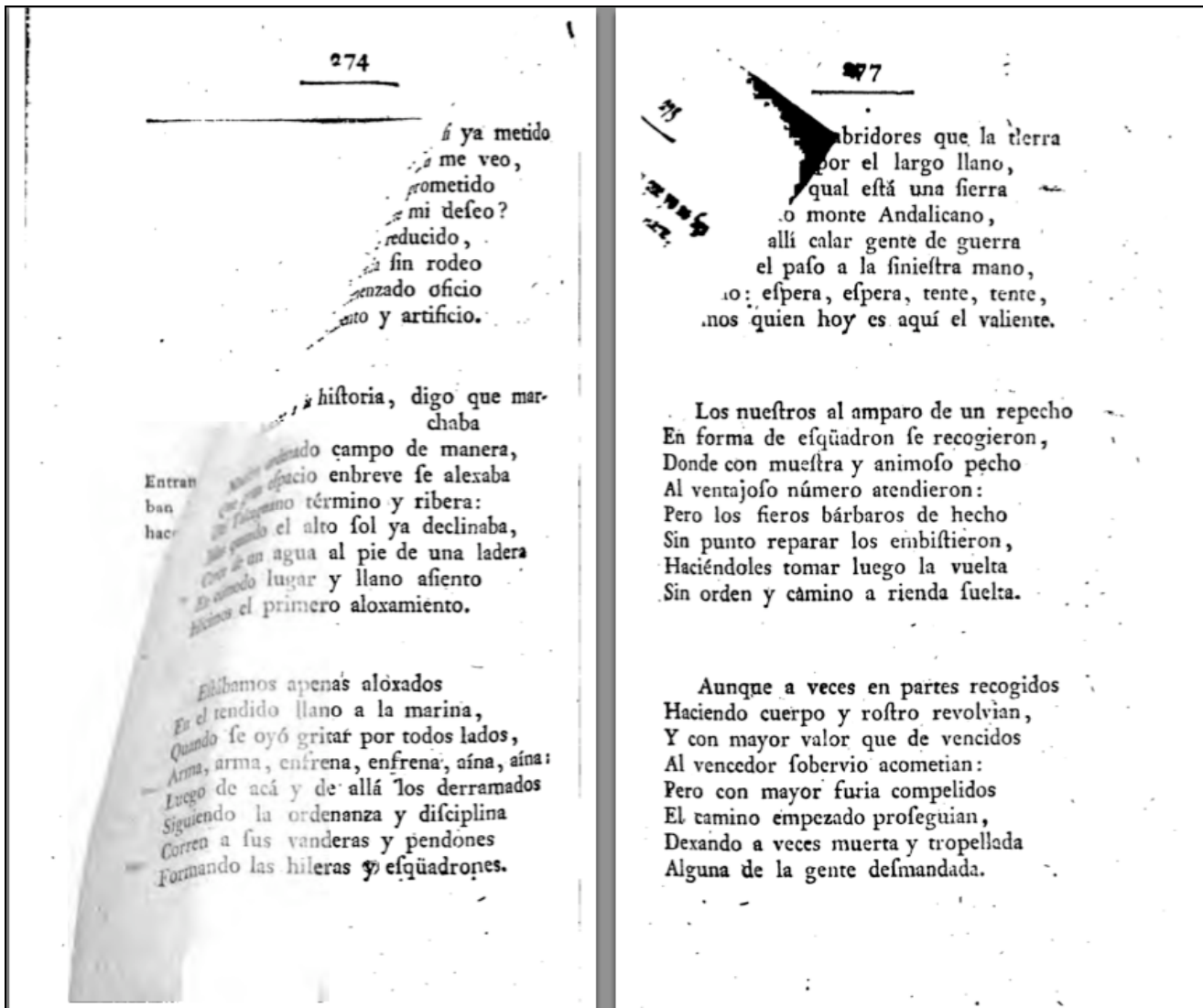


Appendix II: Damaged page.

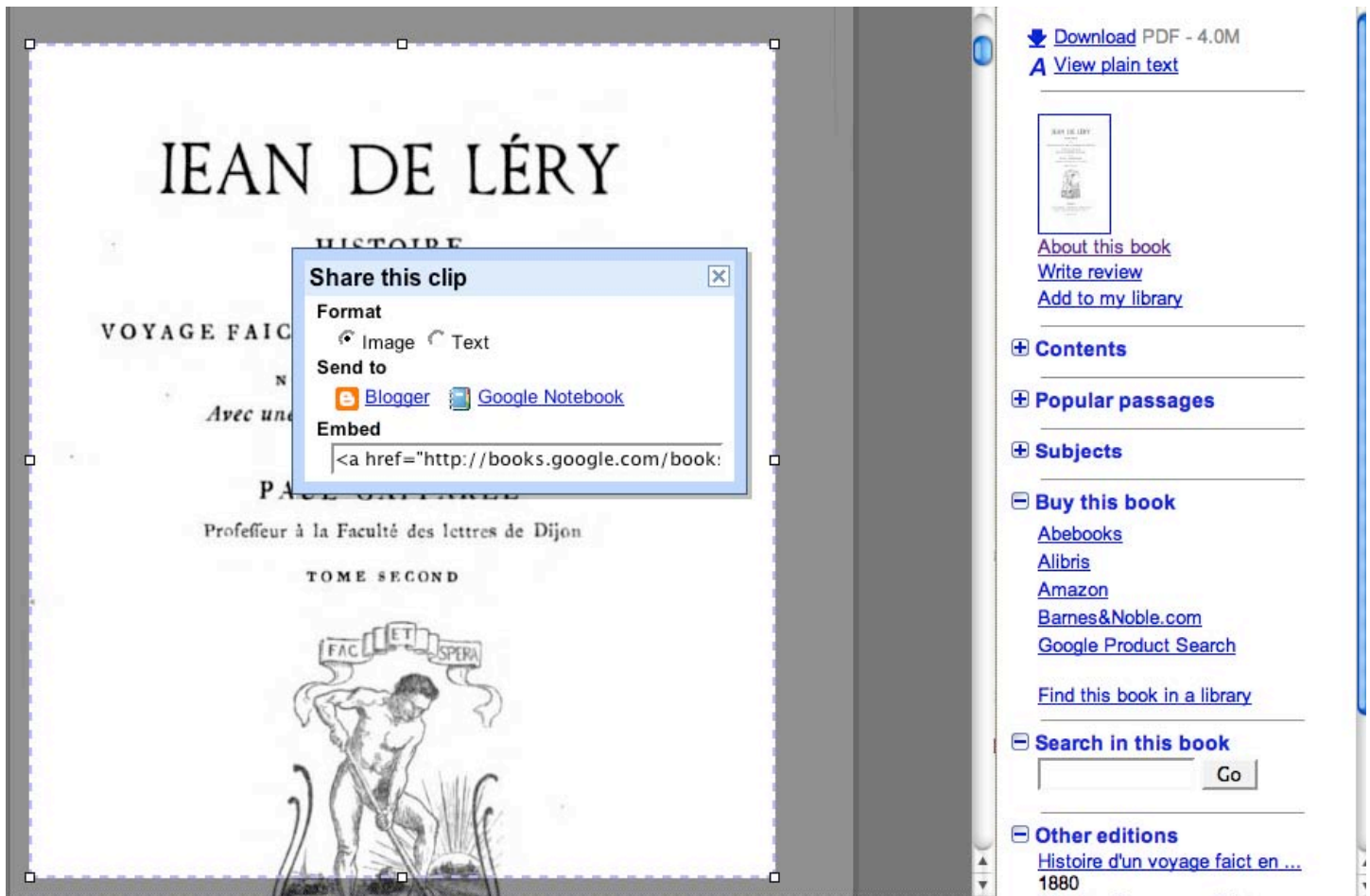

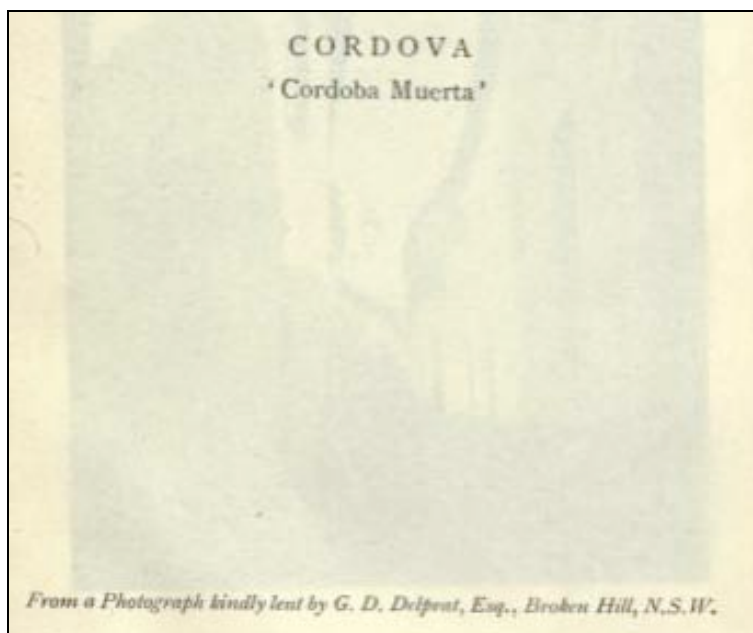

The Popul Vuh, which has been translated as Book of the Council, Book of the Community, Book of the People, and The Sacred Book, is the creation account of the Quiché Mayan people. It contains stories of the cosmologies, origins, traditions and spiritual history of the Mayan people. It is considered by many Mayans as their equivalent to the Christian Bible and is held in deep reverence by them.

The Newberry Library's manuscript of the Popol Vuh is one of the most widely known and possibly the earliest surviving copy. Quiché nobility probably wrote the original manuscript of the Popul Vuh in the mid 16th-century, in the Quiché language, using Latin orthography. The Newberry's Popol Vuh was most likely copied from this original manuscript (now lost) in 1701-03, in the Guatemalan town of Chichicastenango, by Dominican Father Francisco Ximenez. His copy includes the Quiché text and a Spanish translation in side-by-side columns.

In addition to the Popul Vuh, the manuscript also contains a Cakchikel-Quiché-Tzutuhil grammar, Christian devotional instructions, and answers to doctrinal questions and other material by Ximenez.

It is hard to ascertain the condition of the book with a gray-scale scan. There are also numerous quality concerns with the scanning that I will explore below.

Very difficult. There are different spelling variations of the title that provide different search results. Also the title at times is not what it is commonly called today but instead longer titles that depend on the particular author. The metadata is wretched however, listing the author as *Popol-Vuh* itself [which is not correct], and it doesn't include the publisher information. See Appendix I.

It was also difficult finding this particular edition in Google Books. It was only when I searched for "Ximenez, Francisco popol-vuh 1857" that I found the book – thus trying an alternate spelling variation for the title.

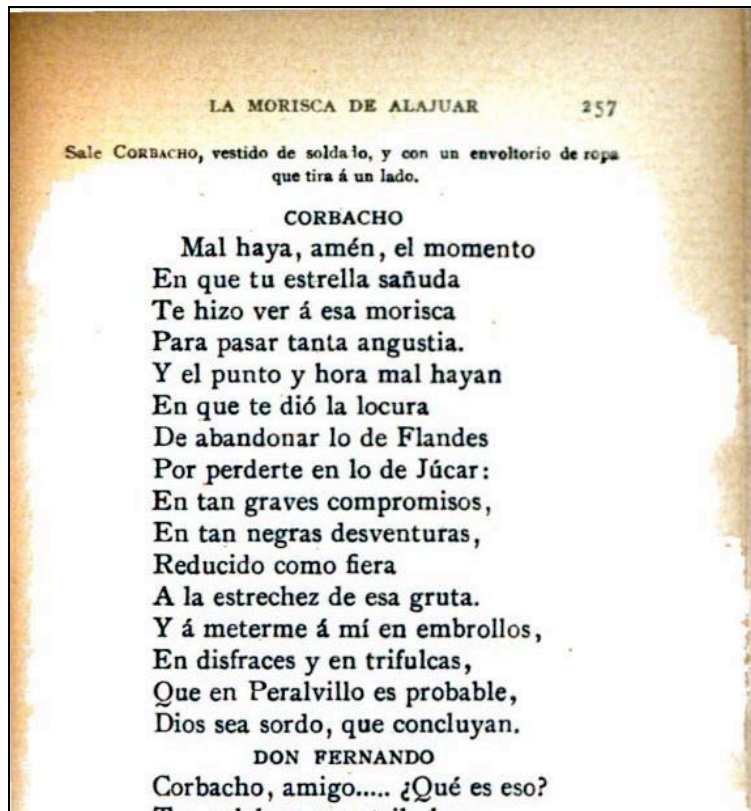

Lope de Aguirre (c. 1510 – 27 October 1561) was a Spanish Basque conquistador in South America. Sent, along with other rebellious settlers, on an impossible mission in search of the mythical El Dorado on the Amazon river, he eventually became their leader and rebelled against Philip II, before being defeated and slain.

He joined the 1560 expedition of Pedro de Ursúa down the Marañón and Amazon Rivers with 300 men and hundreds of natives. A year later, he participated in the overthrow and killing of Ursúa and his successor, Fernando de Guzmán, whom he ultimately succeeded. He and his men reached the Atlantic (probably by the Orinoco River), destroying native villages on the way. In March 23, 1561, Aguirre urged 186 captains and soldiers to sign an act which would proclaim him as prince of Peru, Tierra Firme and Chile.

He is reputed to have said in 1561:

I am the Wrath of God,  
the Prince of Freedom,  
Lord of Tierra Firme and the Provinces of Chile

In 1561, he seized Isla Margarita and brutally suppressed any opposition to his reign. When he crossed to the mainland in an attempt to take Panama, his open rebellion against the Spanish crown came to an end. He was surrounded at Barquisimeto, Venezuela, where he murdered his own daughter Elvira "because someone that I loved so much should not come to be bedded by uncouth people". He also killed several followers who intended to capture him. He was eventually captured and shot. Aguirre's body was cut into quarters and sent to various cities across Venezuela.

This is especially problematic because the other volume is also mislabeled while an earlier edition of the same text (furthermore edited by the same editor) is correctly labeled.
