


Where are the **LCI** participants from?

CLIR and EDUCAUSE have been helping library and IT leaders obtain skills and professional networks to advance organizational change.





Postdoctoral Fellows




DISSERTATION FELLOWS' RESEARCH SITES





TO DATE, THE PROGRAM HAS FUNDED:

- The creation of a reported **2,032** finding aids;
- The processing of **28,149** linear feet of archival materials, plus processing for an additional **1,442** cubic feet of materials;
- The creation of item-level metadata for another **98,488** items; and more.
